LivMS Budget for 2021/22

I have prepared this budget on the following assumptions concerning activities for 2021/22, some of which may be affected by decisions made by the committee at the meeting on 25/03/21 and/or later developments connected with COVID-19.

- 1. Three face-to-face popular lectures (including Christmas lecture).
- 2. Three online popular lectures at zero cost (the poll after Anna Pratoussevitch's talk makes it clear that we should continue with online talks).
- 3. Open Challenge to proceed as normal but with no prizegiving evening (as this year).
- 4. PMQ to take place in face-to-face form (possibly hybrid) at net zero cost (sponsorship by LJMU).
- 5. MA subsidy to continue at same rate.
- 6. All expiring memberships in 2021 to be renewed at the same rate (or equivalent new memberships).
- 7. Roadshow sales to continue at the same rate as this year.
- 8. Bookshop either nor operating or continuing at net zero income.
- 9. Door charges or any new charges make a very minor contribution (if any) to the budget.

There may be some expenses in connection with 2, but I expect them to be minimal. I hope that 6 and 7 are on the pessimistic side.
